President's Report 2019

Happy 40th Birthday to Highvale Netball Club! It is with great pleasure we present our 2nd President's Report in conjunction with this wonderful milestone for the Club. While it is a time to celebrate 40 years of HNC, there is also much to reflect upon in the year that has been 2019.

We are very lucky to have a dedicated Committee supporting us. Many thanks to Ann-Maree Jefferis our Secretary, Sharon Bierenbroodspot our Treasurer, Brooke Whiteside and Tanya Frost our Coach Coordinators, Fiona Bahr our Uniform Coordinator, Tanya Frost our Communications and Social Media Manager and our General Committee Members Carolyn Horvath and Eliza James. A huge thank you to each and every one of you. The Committee of HNC work as a team ensuring everything runs smoothly for all our members.

While it is a team effort, there are a few special "thank yous" we would like to acknowledge. Ann-Maree Jefferis put up her hand to tackle the role of Secretary this year, taking over from Eliza James. Ann-Maree had some big shoes to fill and she has filled them admirably. Sharon Bierenbroodspot took over the Treasurer's role from Marion Hoskin which were also some big shoes to step in too. Sharon accepted the challenge and has done a fantastic job ensuring the club finances are in tip top order. Our Coach Coordinator Brooke Whiteside had to step down during the year due to her work commitments. Tanya Frost took over this role, as well as continuing the Communications and Social Media Manager role. Many thanks to you all for your hard work throughout the year. It has been very much appreciated.

As a domestic netball club, Highvale prides itself on fair play, mate ship and inclusiveness for all our members. HNC aims to create and promote a safe, fun and friendly environment for people of all ages. HNC also aims to engage with the community to offer and encourage participation in netball at a "grass roots level". There is also the added bonus of being involved in a team sport which provides so many benefits to all who participate.

In 2019, HNC continued to maintain and consolidate our relationship with Waverley City (WCNA). While this will be the last year that WCNA run the Saturday competition at Jells Park, not much will change for our Club and its members in 2020. The competition will be run by Waverley Night (WNNA) and it will be business as usual on a Saturday. HNC will endeavor to work with and build a strong relationship with WNNA.

As a Committee we continue to try and improve communication with our members. HNC uses various channels to communicate latest news and events which include email, Team App and Facebook. At training and on game day, there are usually a number of Committee members present who are available and extremely approachable to address any questions, queries or concerns.

A change to the process of paying fees has been implemented this year. Not only does this bring HNC in line with many of the other WCNA/WNNA clubs, but this new process also means HNC will be better organised in terms of knowing the number of teams to be entered each season. It will also lessen the workload for Committee members, all of whom are volunteers with various other family and work commitments to attend to.

We want to provide our current and future members with the best the Club can offer. As a Committee we asked how this could be provided. It was decided that if HNC invested in a program for our coaches, the skills and knowledge learned could in turn be passed on to our players. We were also well aware that our coaches, all of whom volunteer their time, needed to be supported. With this in mind, HNC engaged Sarah Hogan from the thenetballcoach.com to provide a Coach's Workshop and mentoring program which was recently run over 4 weeks. Sarah worked tirelessly with our coaches and a number of our players to help guide, support, and mentor them to further develop their coaching skills. She also provided written feedback and is working with us to develop a training resource our coaches can use moving forward. We think you'll agree a very worthwhile program.

As a club, to be able to move forward, we require new members to join. To instigate this, in 2019 we decided to run a free Netball Taster Session for any new or aspiring netballers to try. These sessions were advertised, planned and run by Samantha Potter over a 3 week period. Many thanks to Samantha for organising these Taster Sessions. It is hoped that running such a program will prompt new members to come and join our wonderful netball club in the future. Hopefully something we can continue to offer next year.

It has been great to hear that many of our junior players have trialed for various representative netball teams in the area. Well done to all who trialed. HNC is very proud of you.

A very special congratulations to Summah Hinchcliffe from our U17 Emeralds, who trialed for VNL. Summah has been offered a contract to play with the Monash Hawks under 19's in 2020.

In the Winter 2019 season, HNC entered 10 teams in total. The 10 teams were made up of 1 in U11s, 3 in U13s, 2 in U15s, 2 in U17s and 2 in Open. 5 of our teams made finals - Gems, Emeralds, Stars, Comets and Bullets. Of these, 4 went through to the Grand Final, of which 2 were successful. Congratulations to under 17 Emeralds and under 15 Stars on winning their Grand Finals. Championship team for Winter 2019 is Stars – Congratulations.

Spring season once again saw 10 teams entered. At the time of writing this, we could have 7 of a possible 9 teams making finals. A fantastic effort. Whatever happens we are sure you will make HNC proud.

We will be saying farewell to a long time Committee member, Eliza James, who is stepping down this year. Eliza has worn many hats for Highvale Netball Club over the years, including player, coach, umpire and Committee member. Last year she was awarded Life Membership at HNC. The Club is forever grateful for all your hard work and dedication over the years. Without this, HNC would not be the club it is today. We wish you well but know we will still see you around the netball courts.

TREASURER'S REPORT

31 October, 2019

The following financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and presentation at the Annual General Meeting.

These reports have been prepared by the Treasurer from bank statements, cheque books, invoices, etc., all kept under the control of the Treasurer.

The club's finances are secured by a strong balance sheet made up primarily of cash at bank of \$17,268.42.

The Profit and Loss for 2019 shows a Loss for the year of \$560.39 – the club is comfortable with this figure given our commitment to coach mentoring this year.

We implemented a new payment strategy for 2020 fees – a shorter payment window with the availability of an 'early bird' cheaper fee option. This has been introduced to assist the committee with fee collection, which unfortunately has become quite time consuming.

The take up rate of the 'early bird' fee option was approximately 50%, which we consider to be incredibly successful, therefore ensuring its viability in coming seasons. So, thank you to all our 'early birds'.

Stock of new and second hand uniforms held @ 31/10/19 is \$5,570.

This has been my first year as Treasurer, and I look forward to continuing in the role in 2020.

COACH CO-ORDINATORS REPORT

I would like to start with 3 cheers to our dedicated coaches for 2019. I am very impressed with the calibre of coaches we have – so much skill, patience and time to show our players the best way to play netball. For the first time, this year we have 5 junior coaches whom have all stepped up to support the club and their teams – it is a delight to see these girls develop their coaching skills and the success they have had in developing their players and their own coaching skills.

As coaches, we all play many different roles throughout the season – we are teachers, managers, leaders, mentors, psychologists, strategists, communicators, motivators and promoters of the sport – I have enjoyed watching all of our coaches wear all of these hats, many times all at once, as they have refined their own coaching philosophy over the year.

Coaching is not just about turning up to the game on Saturday and throwing a ball at training. The amount of time and effort each of them put into preparing training plans, skill development and working on different position combinations to teach our players is incredible. I can't thank you all enough for being organized, enthusiastic, patient, supportive, knowledgeable, caring and having a passionate approach. They are volunteers who give up their valuable time and energy to bring about successes in each and every one of our players and teams.

In Under 11's we have Eliza James, with the support of Carolyn, Kirsten and Ash: developing Highvales' pocket Rockets in Section 3. Congratulations to Eliza and Ryan on the birth of your baby girl Kelsey – we wish you all well. We need to acknowledge the mentoring role Eliza maintained throughout her pregnancy to support Carolyn, Ash and Kirsten to step in once Eliza was on maternity leave, leaving them in a great position to take on the role and doing an amazing job coaching our youngest members of the club. Well done to all players and coaches who have had an amazing year with all players, thoroughly enjoying the end of years Round Robin.

In Under 13's we have 3 teams this year: Jess Stevens and Kasey Thompson (with the assistance of Donna Stevens) with Section 2 Novas. Alyssa Newey and Charlotte Bahr with Section 4 Bullets and Chloe Frost with Section 3 Comets (special Thank you to Brooke Whiteside for your diligence during the winter season). All teams have developed into stronger competitors in under 13's with the guidance of their coaches. I would like to acknowledge these 5 young ladies whom have worked hard to develop their coaching styles. It is very rewarding as a club to see our players give back to the club in such an amazing way – and to do it with composure, expertise and diligence. Thank you to the 5 of you and your reward is in how the players, parents and the club respect and value you all.

Under 15's saw Stars move up from Under 13's into under 15's section 3, to a much faster and physical game, under the guidance of Kate Smedley. Stars were the recipient of the Kevin Currie Champion Team award for the Winter season- congratulations to you all. Stars were supported in the second half of the year by Sophie Papaefraim, who brought her extensive netball knowledge to assist these young ladies to their transition to Under 15's. Under 15's section 3 also had Sapphires coached by Viv Potter and Brad Frost. Viv has mentored Brad who has never coached netball before, and he soon discovered that coaching netball was not that different from the football field and just as rewarding. In the Spring Season, Stars and Sapphires were in the same section and have been tight competition to each other all season.

Under 17's is a hard age group to coach, as other priorities enter the girls' lives. Peter Bartlett found himself coaching an expanded Gems, in section 4, as we had to disband Magic due to low numbers of players. Peter and indeed the team of Gems took on the new players like they were always part of the team, as a team they decided on how game day would be structured and made the semi-finals in the

Winter season. A special Thank you to Peter for turning up week after week to train the handful of girls that are able to come to training. Also, in Under 17's Emeralds, section 1 saw Donna Stevens at the head of this inspiring group of girls; many of the girls in this team not only play, but also coach and umpire for Highvale. Emeralds have had a successful year with a few changes as they could no longer train as a team and other competing squad teams saw change to their original structure, though they played every game with heart and soul.

Moving into Open means that they no longer have a coach or attend training but there is still a team manager/captain for each of the teams to ensure that the seasons run smoothly. Sophie Papaefraim supported Flyers whom moved into Open section 6 for the first time. The girls have a lot of fun and just enjoy playing the game of netball. With a number of them completing year 12 this year, it's been a great distraction from their studies. Our other Open team is Zigzags in section 4, supported by Jess Hunt. ZigZags struggled initially for numbers, however with a few ex Highvale players returning during Spring, it has meant they have been able to field a team each week building on their confidence and playing some great netball. Both Zigzags and Flyers will enter into finals for Spring, which is a great effort. It's great to see our Open teams continue to enjoy their netball and thrive.

All of our 2019 coaches are to be thanked and congratulated for the successes they have achieved throughout the year. Their role is largely underestimated and forever growing, yet they manage to create a fun and safe environment to empower our players, provide opportunities, build confidence and reflect, shape, focus, enhance and promote our game. One thing that makes coaching in the junior ages a little easier is the help and support of a team manager. Across our teams we have a number of parents (listed below) who have put their hands up to help with this role, from organising captains and fruit rosters to chasing up to ensure there are enough players for the games. Winter & Spring (Section 3)

Our first year out of Development! While the gap in height between us and our opponents seemed to grow bigger, so did our desire to improve. This year has seen our skills refine and our training sessions become more complex. Holding and making space has been a huge focus and has been helped by introducing some basic court-plays, both from the centre-pass and defensive throw-ins. This has really helped us to further understand the various court positions and promoted better teamwork. In attack, we have spent time practicing driving onto the circle to best feed our goalers and are learning to work the ball closer to the post by properly positioning our wings and offering between goalers. In defence, we are learning how to defend with our feet and shoulders, though what has really been a standout is our ability to take clean intercepts on our opponents.

Rockets are lucky to have so many coaches, which has meant that we have been able to combine various small-group training drills into every session and get lots of guidance on Saturday's. Rockets might be small in size, but we have big personalities and muscle-hands to match — I am so pleased to see how the girls have matured and grown as netballers this year.

Winter (Section 4)
