HNC is very fortunate to have a fantastic squad of coaches. A list of all our coaches can be found at the start of the 2021 Annual Report. Please take the time to read through all the names. Our amazing coaches have continued to give up their time throughout the year whether it was running training, attending games, writing emails or running Zooms online to check in on their team. They provide an abundance of guidance and support to our players ensuring they all have the best possible netball experience. 2020 and 2021 have certainly been challenging. Our coaches have managed to juggle their own family and/or school commitments. As a club we are extremely grateful.

Thanks also to those that put up their hands to be a team manager. Your assistance in keeping players and parents informed of news and updates together with what is needed and/or expected is much appreciated.

After very little netball was played in 2020 we were all looking forward to 2021 with the hope of a better year ahead. 8 teams were entered by HNC in the WNNA Autumn 2021 season. This was made up of 1 x U13, 2 x U15, 2 x U17, 3 x open teams.

Before 2021 could commence the Committee did plenty of work behind the scenes. This included coordinating the roll-over, donation or refunding of 2020 fees. We appreciate the patience and cooperation of our members during this process. Many thanks to those members who so kindly donated their fees to the club. Such generosity after a tough year was just wonderful.

With the outdoor courts at Jells Park getting a much needed upgrade, the Autumn season was run in a different format. All games were played on the indoor courts with U17 and younger teams playing on a Saturday, while all open teams played their games on a Sunday evening. It was so good to see all our players and coaches back out on the netball court. Unfortunately, the season was not without disruption. COVID struck yet again, meaning there were a few snap lockdowns. Thankfully though, most games were able to be played.

At the end of the Autumn season, our U13 Novas and Open Emeralds made it to the finals which was a fantastic achievement. Well done to both teams. Congratulations to Emeralds who won their Grand Final, when it was eventually played. Once again COVID caused delays with the GF being pushed back a number of times. Emeralds were also the winners of the Kevin Currie Champion Team Trophy, which is awarded to the team who finishes the home and away games for the Autumn season with the highest number of points.

Recruiting new players has been high on the agenda for the Committee. Bearing this in mind, HNC made the decision to run a Net Set Go style skills session during the Autumn 2021 season aimed at up and coming netballers. These sessions were run by Donna Stevens who was ably assisted by Jessie Bahr. The sessions were run over a 12 week period and held at the same time as Wednesday night team training at Sportlink. These sessions were a great success. Lots of fun was had by all who attended. The end result being that for the first time ever HNC was able to enter an U9 team in the WNNA spring 2021 season. A big thank you must go to Donna for all her planning and co-ordinating of the skills development program. Donna's hard work was the key to ensuring this program was so successful.

Planning and preparation for the Spring 2021 season saw HNC once again enter 8 teams. The makeup of these teams did differ slightly to the previous season. 1 x U9, 1 x U13, 2 x U15, 2 x U17, 2 x Open. While we gained an U9 team, we did have to combine 2 of our open teams. Zig Zags and Flyers joined forces to become the Hybrids.

There was much excitement and anticipation for this upcoming season as it was to be the debut of the new HNC dresses. Unfortunately, another COVID lockdown put this much anticipated unveiling on hold.

The new HNC dresses and boy's tops have been long planned by the committee. There had been plenty of discussion around the style, design and budget. We at HNC are very fortunate to have the very talented Mon Hunt on the committee. While we all threw around ideas of what we would like to see in the new dress design, Mon is the one who made it all come together. Another huge thank you must also go to our Uniform Co-ordinator, Fiona Bahr. Fiona investigated various suppliers, chased up prices and time frames. Energetic ended up being the supplier of our HNC dresses and boy's tops. Fiona was our main point of contact doing all the liaising with Energetic. Fiona also co-ordinated dress and top fittings for all our players. Many thanks to Fiona for all her hard work ensuring our new dresses and boy's tops came together seamlessly. Many thanks to Mon for taking on board all the ideas thrown her way and coming up with the new design. The new dresses and boy's tops look sensational. We cannot wait to see them out on the netball court.

As a committee, we all agreed that it would be great to be able to help our members with the new uniform transition by subsidising some of the cost. Along with the fees donated from 2020, HNC was very lucky to be the recipient of a number of grants. The donated fees and some of the grant money were put towards the cost of the new dresses.

With the new dresses finally becoming a reality, it was decided that this would also be the perfect time to update the HNC logo. Again, many thanks to Mon for coming up with the new design. It is the perfect

blend of the old and new, paying homage to the famous 'Highvale Squiggle". With her wonderful talent being utilised in the design of both our new dresses and logo, Mon has given HNC a much needed update bringing our club into the twenty first century.

HNC was once again in the process of gaining the expertise of Nardelli Coaching to run some specialist coaching sessions for our players in 2021. Unfortunately, as with 2020 this did not go ahead. We are hopeful that we can use some of our grant money to provide these coaching sessions to our players in 2022.

Throughout the year, and in particular during lockdown, the Committee has continued to meet via Zoom. One of the items on the Agenda has been the reviewing and updating of our club policies. These have now been ticked off and will not need to be reviewed again for another two years. A review of the HNC Constitution has also been done. A few minor changes were made. Hopefully you have all had a chance to read through the Constitution which was sent out with the AGM Agenda and note the changes that have been proposed. We will need to vote and pass these changes during the AGM.

With lockdown easing, WNNA announced they were organising a Round Robin of 4 games commencing in late November. As we write this report, the Committee is busy working out players and teams to play in this Round Robin, together with (hopefully) some training sessions that can be run in the lead up to getting some play in before the end of the year. The Club will pay for both the Round Robin and training with money received from Grants. We are looking forward to seeing our players and coaches back out on the netball court.

Sadly, nothing lasts forever and we must say farewell to some of our current Committee members who are stepping down after a number of years helping run HNC. Thank you Ann-Maree, Sharon and Kim for giving your time so generously to help run our wonderful netball club over the last few years. Your contribution has been much appreciated.

Bearing in mind that there are some Committee members "hanging up their hats" we would not only love, but really need to see some new faces join the Committee in 2022. Our netball club cannot run without people putting up their hand and volunteering their time to lend a hand. Being on committee is a great opportunity to not only contribute to the running of the club and ensuring a great netball experience for your child, but also being part of a group of likeminded people and share in the satisfaction of a job well done. We are a team here at HNC and it is an extremely rewarding experience not only for yourself but also for your child/ren as they see you take an interest in one of their activities. Please give some thought to joining.

TREASURER'S REPORT

31 October 2021

The following financial statements have been prepared for distribution to members and presentation at the Annual General Meeting.

These reports have been prepared by the Treasurer from bank statements, invoices, etc., all kept under the control of the Treasurer.

The club's finances are secured by a strong balance sheet made up primarily of cash at bank of \$18,510.71.

The Profit and Loss for 2021 shows a Profit for the year of \$1,783.22 – the club is comfortable with this figure. Holding our 2020 AGM via zoom and limited play in 2021 have been the contributing factors in lower expenses for the club this year.

Spring season 2021 didn't proceed as planned, therefore we are able to once again offer a rollover option for those fees to cover Autumn 2022 season's fees.

We received \$2,000 in government grants in 2021 – and it was this funding that was behind our decision to redesign the club's logo and freshen up our current uniforms.

Stock of new uniforms held @ 31/10/21 is \$2,070. We have written-off approximately \$5,235 of stock (second hand uniforms and several old-style dresses).

This has been my third and final year as Treasurer - as I have a new job that demands much of my time and a daughter no longer playing netball, the time is right for me to hand over the role to Carolyn Horvath. She has a background in accounting and vast experience in voluntary committee work, so I have no doubt she will do an admirable job as Treasurer.

In 2021, Highvale was finally able to trial our new Highvale skills development program. The program is based on the Suncorp Net Set Go 3 tier program, designed especially for children to transition into junior netball with confidence.

Our program was a condensed version, initially offered over a 6 week timeframe. Due to its success, it turned into 12 weeks. Our aim was to recruit new players, build a positive introduction to netball, through skill-based activities, minor games, and modified matches. With the prospect of building a team to play games at Jells Park in the second half of 2021.

We advertised our program through local schools, local shopping centres and via social media. We started off slowly with 4 children attending. 2 of them had older siblings playing and they were extremely excited to be able to play 'netball just like their sisters'.
